



Competition Guidelines

Begin the search for candidates in March/April through

- Schools
- Youth Clubs
- Scouts and Guides
- Hospitals
- Police groups
- Churches
- St. John Ambulance Brigade
- Red Cross
- Other youth organisations

Organise District Finals by mid-January.

Compete in Multiple District Finals in February.

The MD winner qualifies for a place at Europa Forum for the European Finals in September/October of the same year.

To remind you, Young Ambassador candidates are judged on:

- Their community service activity.
- Personality and demonstration of leadership qualities.
- Their proposed use of the bursary.
- The ability to speak about their service activities.
- Commitment to take part in the Multiple District Finals weekend, which is a mixture of work and fun, including an informal ice-breaking evening, an activity like bowling and a Gala Dinner with entertainment by them followed by a disco.

And the winner needs to be committed to:

- Addressing MD Convention.
- Attending a Youth Camp.
- Representing their Multiple District at Europa Forum in the European Final.

And what do we as Lions gain from Young Ambassadors?

- Inspiration from young people and the amazing things they get up to.
- Inspiration from their energy and commitment and willingness to have a go.
- New young friends, who, with their parents and friends we would hope to involve in Lionism in the future.
